This workshop is for writers at any stage of their writing who need a creative boost.

At each session, the group will examine a different component of creative writing, including: Location, Plot, Character, Dialogue, Era, Genre, Point of view, and Show don't tell. The course will help you to focus on you as a writer and will leave you with achievable goals to continue your writing journey.
